

In our current modern day there is another popular sitcom called "Modern Family." This sitcom covers similar topics in a modern day format that for some may also be offensive but helps address some of the issues that are present in our daily lives.

All of us have family dynamics from time to time that tell a story of heartache and comedy. We often refer to different types of families such as blended families, diverse families, big or small families, and some even dysfunctional families. The definition of family has broadened and in light of our faith it includes members from all walks of life. Families change over time and learning how to adjust to those different aspects of family is helpful during different stages of our lives. The one thing Debbie and I learned early on when we moved to Florida is how much we miss our immediate family, but have also grown to realize how much this church community is our family.



It is comforting to have a church family to share in the joys and trials of life. The Bible is filled with the lineage language from Adam and Eve to David and Jesus. The key words for all of us is to know is that it is not about being a certain heritage, but being part of the greater human family created in the image of God. Human families reflect our very nature that can at times be difficult, yet when Christ is the head of the family it changes everything.

During February we experience the Valentine's Day holiday and yearn to be loved. Being part of the family of God begins with His love, and this month we can be comforted in that fact. In the song "Bind us Together" the lyrics state, "You are the family of God. You are the promised divine." The last Renovation Information Session is scheduled for <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>February 18th at 2pm</u> in the Fellowship Hall for people who were unable to attend one of the sessions held in November. This is the last session providing information on the Narthex Renovation Project before the Congregation Meeting on March 1st.

Narthex Renovation Congregation Meeting

The Narthex Renovation Committee along with Beebe Design of Venice, Florida will be presenting the Narthex Renovation Project for Congregational approval on <u>Sunday</u>, <u>March 1st after the 11am service</u>. The congregation will have an opportunity to review the building's design and layout along with a visual presentation of all remodeled areas of the narthex facility. A Construction Budget, Financing Terms and a Proposed Pledge Program will be presented for congregation approval.

According to Emmanuel's constitution, a minimum of 80 voting members (Active and Seasonal) or 10% of the congregation must be present at the Narthex Renovation meeting to meet the quorum required to conduct business.

Dear friends, colleagues, family and loved ones,

Today is the tenth anniversary of the deadly earthquake that ravaged and took the lives and dreams of a nation; a country considered by the statistics of the world as being the poorest country of the Western Hemisphere. January twelfth was the day where joy became despair and the dreams of so many were shattered in a drama that lasted just 35 seconds. No record could really tell us the extent of the



damage such as how many people died or how many houses were destroyed. This day is a part of my History and the History of ten million plus Haitian that will never be erased in our memory. This tells us as well we cannot let this 35 seconds put us down. We have to stand tall and face that new reality and not let it put us down. We have to live in spite our pain and sorrows and know with assurance that we can go very far with those who are still alive and give them hope.

The book of James put it very well: "Suppose a brother or a sister is without clothes and daily food. If one of you says to them, "Go in peace; keep warm and well fed," but does nothing about their physical needs, what good is it? In the same way, faith by itself, if it is not accompanied by action, is dead. But someone will say, "You have faith; I have deeds." Show me your faith without deeds, and I will show you my faith by my deeds. You believe that there is one God. Good! Even the demons believe that—and shudder. You foolish person, do you want evidence that faith without deeds is useless? This summarizes our call and responsibility as the Christian body to be the hands of those without hands, the feet of the lame and the eyes of the blind and the hope of the hopeless.

We will never forget the life of Ben Larson and so many people crushed by the rubbles and the structures poorly built as the result of the rampant poverty here. No, we will never forget. On January twelve we stumbled but we did not fall. Nevertheless, to regain balance it is not easy. Changes do not happen overnight. We still need the help and support of all the churches and the philanthropists of the ELCA wider church, the Florida Bahamas Synod, Emmanuel Lutheran Church in Venice, Faith Lutheran Church in Sarasota and all the congregations who have responded lovingly and graciously through their prayers and donations. A lot has been accomplished with your support such as: fresh water to some of the communities, dairies, agricultural accompaniment (poultry programs, goats project, seeds project), capacity building, micro landing to women, school for children, community centers being built for shelters etc. The list is very long. But it is a drop of water in the humongous work to be done. We always come from crisis to crisis. People are still living under tents, we still have food a crisis, a large number of the population does not have access to clean water, electricity, and schools. It is a long road. However, with love and determination we will eventually get to our destination.

We give God thanks for the good works that the ELCA wider church is doing with the Florida Bahamas Synod through Global mission to accompany Haiti to stand back on its feet. We are very blessed to see we are well surrounded by friends and loved ones who care.

Please, pray for us as we remember this nightmare that put us very far behind!!!




