For many of us it brought back memories of Irma and the ordeal that we experienced in one form or other last year. Watching

the forecast maps of the hurricane made me think of the path of Irma and how Venice was right in the middle of the path. We were prepared for the worst and when we were spared the pain it gave us opportunity to count our blessings. It also provided us with a newfound compassion for those who go through tough things in life such as natural disasters that are outside of our control.

When I look back and reflect on my first hurricane experience I recall how it changed my life. I remember sitting watching my phone radar in the dark hallway where Debbie and I took shelter covered with pillows. It made both of us cherish the memories and belongings that we have in our home and at church because those things could have been destroyed very quickly. It also made me appreciate the days when the weather is peaceful and that we do not need to fear the forecast of uncertainty. It makes our rain showers in the afternoon a mere inconvenience.

We often cling to the things that will not last, and it gives us insight into what we truly value in our lives. Our relationships are at the heart of what is important and the other things will not last. Even our relationships can quickly change course due to illness or an unexpected event in our lives. In times of uncertainty when we secure our doors the message of faith helps us value our God who comforts and shelters us in times of trouble. Even when Jesus was in the boat with the disciples they were fearful, and that is helpful to remember because even the most faithful can falter. The most important message is that God is faithful and we are invited to live in that faithfulness through all our storms.

Acting on this thought, WELCA is reorganizing its structure to make it a bit more "user" friendly in a way. Realizing that an organization needs to adapt but not move from its purpose. We come together for "study, support and action" as it states in our constitution. We have moved away from a strict governing board, with a president and several sitting members that meets monthly. In April when our present dedicated, hardworking President Pam Neal 's tenure is completed in April, we will move to more of a committee type leadership.
