I am thrilled to let you know that the Alzheimer Caregiver Support group is meeting at Emmanuel again (the group had moved to VOTI). Starting on Tuesday, June 21st, the group will meet at the church office at 1:00pm, in the office lounge. They will continue to meet the 3rd Tuesday of every month at 1:00pm. A brochure from the Alzheimer's Association-Florida Gulf Coast Chapter is available in the wire display rack in the Narthex. If you care for someone with Alzheimer's or know of someone who does, this association is a great resource.

In **JULY** there is going to be two happenings:

On Sunday, July 10th during the Coffee Hour, there is going to be a presentation from MetroCrime Prevention of Florida. They are going to do a free crime and identity theft awareness workshop. Some of the material covered will be Caller ID Scams, Medicare Fraud, Face book problems, grandchildren scams, and traveling thefts (particularly relating to room key cards.) Even when we feel we are safe in our gated communities and our home security system is on, we are still vulnerable. MetroCrime Prevention will give us valuable and lifesaving information to help us be proactive against crime, and take simple precautions that will enhance our personal safety.

Wednesday, July 20th, from 10 am – 3pm, the Alzheimer's Association Memory Mobile will be here to do Memory Screenings. We all forget things, but is it simple forgetfulness because our brains are too full because we are so busy, or is it something more serious? During this 20 minute screening, you are given a paper test to learn if you have any real memory issues. It is not a medical diagnosis, just a screening to get a baseline or to possibly bring to light an issue that may need to be brought to your physician's attention. Also available on this bus is information and referrals, care consultations and even caregiver training if that is what you need. To make an appointment, call Barb Spenks at 488-4942 ext. 20. The 20 minute slots fill up quickly, so call early to get the time that works best for you! For people waiting for their appointment time or while their loved one gets screened, refreshments will be available in the Fellowship Hall.

Family Promise of South Sarasota County (FPSSC) is an interfaith non-profit organization focused on providing support to families with minor children who have lost their homes. In order to reverse the cycle of minors affected by homelessness, it is the mission of FPSSC to offer qualifying shelter for up to 90 days. Thirteen area congregations of different denominations and faiths take turns hosting families for weekly periods. Emmanuel has been a charter host church since the beginning of operations of FPSSC in October, 2015.

FPSSC and its host congregations have provided families with housing, meals, case management services, options for daycare and employment, as well as financial, legal and counseling services. To date we have helped 11 families to successfully move on to safe and affordable housing on their own with the parents fully employed.

Emmanuel has completed its third rotation of hosting families and will host again the weeks of August 28 – September 4th and November 27th – December 4th. Anyone interested in helping with set up and takedown, furnishing evening meals, evening fellowship, or overnight hosting may contact Lynn Crandall (jl827@earthlink.net) to be included on our volunteer list. Many hands have made our first three rotations successful and rewarding. We welcome one and all to participate in this wonderful outreach program.

GLOBAL MISSIONS



FROM HAITI:

We hope many of you were on hand May 8th during Coffee Hour for the presentation by Pastor Hall, Lois Steketee and Chuck Zetner after their travels to Haiti. The following is from Lois Steketee as she reflects about the trip:

While Haiti is a complex land, it is also home to almost 10 million people. It was a struggle for the Haitians to become the first independent black republic and it remains a struggle today, but it is still home to the Haitians. Is it a home like the USA, absolutely not. It makes our poorest areas look like havens of comfort. Does that make it any less a "home, absolutely not.

Haiti is accustom to natural disasters. The earthquake in 2010 is an example. Over 10,000 NGO (Non Governmental Organizations) have rushed in to help a country in distress. Has this help been an overwhelming success, absolutely not. Like any country there have been success stories and failures. Each NGO is certain though that they each have the answer.

Would we want the world to rush in and tell us how to fix our problems? Probably not. It would be interesting to see who would win the presidential election if we let the world decide for us. I don't think we would be willing to take that chance.

What Haiti does need is the chance to hear that God loves them and that even though they are walking through their "valley", God is always near. At the moment, Haitians mostly hear Voodoo or a combination of Voodoo and Catholicism, which some do not consider to be Christian. The Haitians deserve to hear about a God of Grace!

Pastor Livenson Lauvanus is the President of the Lutheran Church of Haiti. He is our representative that helps to spread the Word of God. It is not a large church but then again, Jesus was never concerned about numbers. He simply instructed his disciples to go and spread the Good News!

Not only are we to spread the Good News, but we are to listen to the people and find out where they are physically and spiritually. Maybe we are learning that the lesson in Haiti is not to go in and tell them what to do, but to listen first and respond second. That is a tough lesson for Americans to learn because we think we have all the answers.

Instead of giving answers, the real journey is in finding out what Haiti was, is and can be. In the process, we may just find ourselves becoming the students in learning how to share the Good News.


