Living Nativities are always intriguing to people who want to see real animals and people standing in a real stable. Seeing the live portrayal helps bring the story of the baby Jesus to life in an intimate way. Several years ago, I encouraged the church community where I was serving to have a living nativity. We had a rustic simple stable with hay and the donkey, several goats, sheep and members of the community playing parts for all the people in the story. We had everything you could imagine; the clothes, props, and every smell that goes along with having live animals in the scene. The nativity also included the farmer who owned all the animals to make sure the animals didn't run away, and to make sure everything was safe.

One evening while I was observing all the activity happening outside the farmer came up to the sanctuary door of the church and wanted to use the phone. I looked at him and said, "Before you enter the church tell me that is not what I think it is on your boots." He looked down at his boots smiled and said, "Yes, it is what you think it is." Then I told him that it would be best if he cleaned his boots and then he would be able to enter the sanctuary. When I think of that living nativity it



occurred to me that is what the real message of Christmas is about: having our God come down to Earth to walk with us and all the smells of our lives.

On Christmas evening we will hear the words for the Gospel of John, "The Word became flesh and dwelt among us full of grace and truth." God knows exactly what we need in life to draw us into a living relationship with Him. God also enters the world that is filled with hurt and sometimes things that stick to our lives like sin. This reminds us of God's humanity who understands our lives and save us from sin and those things that separate us from each other and God. The first living nativity continues to breathe fresh life into a world that needs a God who loves all people and empowers us to meet others in a real way. God continues to dwell in our lives and reveals the hope we have in eternal life. Maybe some year in the future a living nativity will come to Emmanuel!



From the Minister of Music and Worship: Kristene Hoeh Bowker

We begin a new church year with **Advent**, a wonderful and challenging liturgical season!

The Advent wreath can be traced to the Romans' ancient rite of waiting in the darkness for the return of the sun, and for the Feast of the Sun on December 25. The ancients took a wheel off their wagons and fastened torches to it to see them through the darkness. The only thing alive in the winter, evergreen, was brought inside and fastened to the wheel. To those huddled in darkness, it was a sign of vegetation and springtime. More than three hundred years ago, German Christians fashioned the same elements in the Advent wreath—the circle of greens, a sign of hope and eternity; the candles, a promise of light. What was once the Feast of the Sun has become for us the Feast of the Son.

Advent wreaths and Advent calendars are symbols and tools of what this season urges us to do: mark the passage of time as we wait. Despite all evidence to the contrary, Advent is about the art of waiting. Yes, holiday decorations have been on store shelves since well before Halloween, and the world declares everything after Thanksgiving Day the "Christmas season." But for us December 2nd begins Advent season, a time for slowing down and gathering together . . . to wait. As with the ancients, we gather in the darkness and wait for the light. With Biblical texts and church traditions, Advent challenges us to honor these dark days, waiting with courage and hope, lighting candles to beckon the Light of the World . . . and hearing the words that promise a Savior.

Troesters in Zambia







As some of you may know, our ministry with ELCA has recently taken a new turn. After serving as ELCA's East Africa Regional Representatives for four and a half years, we were asked to consider a move to Zambia, to assist the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Zambia (ELCZa) with their educational and leadership development needs.

To make a long story short, we accepted the invitation and have recently arrived in Lusaka, a beautiful city not far from the iconic Victoria Falls. Lusaka is also the headquarters of the ELCZa. This small church, established in 1983, has endured many struggles throughout its history, but now is on firmer footing, having just elected a new lead pastor (similar to a presiding bishop) and leadership team. ELCA Global Mission has been searching for someone with the right skills to

accompany this church for over three years now, ever since the former missionary had returned to the U.S. Joe and I bring twelve years of experience living and serving in Africa to this position, and the ELCZa has welcomed us with open arms. We hope that our knowledge and experience may assist this church as they seek to strengthen their impact in Zambia.
