“Friends are patient, friends are kind, friends are not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. In fact, yoga does so much for your health that studies show people who do yoga use 43% fewer medical services, and they save anywhere from \$640 to more than \$25,000!"

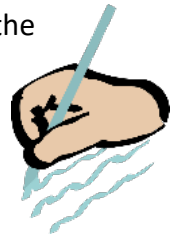


Jan Quinn's Chair Exercise Class

Lyrics of Lent – 2019

Our 2019 midweek Lenten worship series will focus on the hymns of Lent, the songs that bring us quietly and intimately to the cross to meditate on the story of Jesus' saving love for us. The hymns of Lent—old and new, with their rich images and impressions—will help us to walk and wait with Jesus this year, to witness his suffering, and to treasure the gift of his sacrificial love.

Martin Luther once wrote, "next to the Word of God, the noble art of music is the greatest treasure in the world." He considered music "a marvelous creation of God," especially as it relates to the Scriptures. As a writer of many hymns, Luther believed that hymn lyrics gave the common people a way to express their Christian faith, and the hymn tunes provided a path into their hearts and memories.

In our midweek services, the melodies and lyrics of hymns such as "O Sacred Head" and "Go to Dark Gethsemane" will beckon us to kneel at the foot of the cross. Join us for these special Wednesday evenings. Ash Wednesday is March 6th with services at 10 a.m. and 7 p.m.

Our "Lyrics of Lent" series begins March 13th with the worship meditation starting at 5:30 p.m. in the sanctuary, and a "lite" supper following in Fellowship Hall.

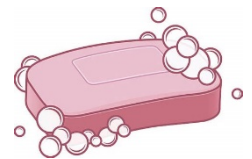

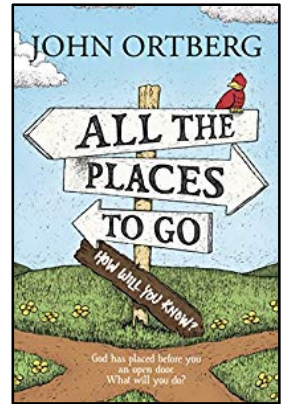

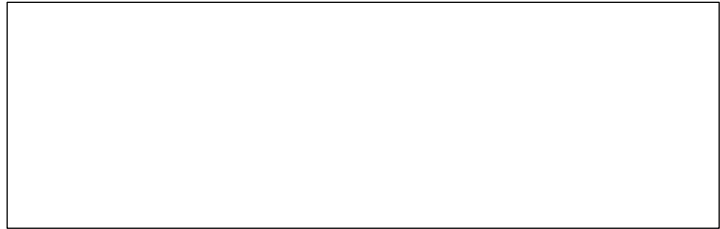
