"Art Works"



Being an artist is a natural gift and every so often I wish that I had the skills to paint and create art. There is a clay pot in my office that looks like a door stop and not worthy of a place on my bookshelf. I created that piece of art years ago and it was almost thrown away. Overtime the pot has been saved and has constantly reminded me that God is the potter and we are the clay. God's handiwork

continues to create and shape our life just as an artist creates art. The apostle Paul stated, "Anyone in Christ is new creation." God is constantly creating new life in us through our faith. While some people are naturally gifted, being an artist is not easy for us who have attempted to paint only to find the reality doesn't reflect the picture in our head. Artists have a way of bringing to life those images that we cherish, and religious artwork has adorned many cathedrals and churches throughout the years.

Michelangelo's work adorns the Sistine Chapel capturing the story of faith as portrayed in Biblical scenes. One of the most painted images we see in our faith is Jesus on the cross. In my office I have a beautiful piece of original art of the crucified Christ. Along with the image of Jesus is an image of a circle that surrounds the cross. Each time I look at the painting I see my reflection in the glass that frames the picture. The painting reminds me that Christ died for us and affirms the words that many of us learned as children, "For God so loved the world that he gave his only son that whoever believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life." God gives us new life through the words of the Gospel. Artists bring to life that word which helps us affirm our understanding of faith through visual representations.

Artists create images for others that instill deeper meaning or imagination in the viewer. The circle in my painting reminds me of the circle of life that happens for all who believe that the cross is the final word. The victory of his death on the cross completes God's plan for the world. Every year we celebrate Easter and it marks another year for us to embrace the hope of how God's love continues to shape our lives. God continues to create life in us just as an artist paints a picture. God gives us purpose to share his love through service, and empower others with the power of the resurrection. This Easter we have the privilege of watching Pastor Oman create a piece of artwork that will capture the story of the resurrection. In watching we too are reminded that we will be resurrected into a new life of faith.

A Note from the President

Early last month I was part of a wonderful workshop put on by WELCA. I can remember afterward sitting in my study and smiling to myself, I had learned a new word – adiaphora. I can't pronounce it right, but the meaning of it sure made my heart feel light. I would like to give you my layman's understanding of it. It may differ from a complete theological view point, but I like my description.

It refers to all the customs and traditions we have developed in our church service that help us relate to God. These rituals and customs are definitely bible based and go back many centuries. Like I said, they have given us order. But, were these liturgies and customs dictated by Jesus? Did Jesus and his disciples write the hymns that we sing? What Jesus did say was that there were two important things he wanted us to do to remember him. We call these sacraments communion and baptism. He never gave us criteria on how to conduct a service.

I would imagine that the church service has changed some over the centuries as it reflected what the culture was at the time. That should give us the reassurance that our church services may change somewhat in language and style, as long as we maintain our communication and worship of God.

As I sit here and think about what I hope you will take away from my "note" is that some change is okay-maybe even necessary to reflect what we are at this moment in time and that it is okay.

Farmworkers Self-Help, Inc. (FSH), located in Dade City, Pasco County, Florida, was incorporated as a 501(c)(3) non-profit corporation in 1982. It was organized as a grassroots effort by immigrant Mexican and Mexican-American migrant farmworkers and former farmworkers to find solutions to the problems of the farmworker population.

Resurrection House Mission is an authorized ELCA worshiping community. It is dedicated to bringing God's word to the poorest of the poor in Tommytown on the north end of Dade City. The mission provides: Sunday church meetings where hot meals are served in a nurturing family-like atmosphere. It provides proactive role models. It teaches multidisciplinary cultural arts and academic skills. Clothing, shoes are supplied as well as school supplies.
