From the Desks of Our Pastors

Dear Families and Friends of Emmanuel,

The themes of the scripture readings, following the Christmas celebration, in the weeks after Epiphany, reflect on the beginning of the spread of the gospel of Jesus Christ. During the last three weeks of January we members of Emmanuel are going to be intentionally thinking about our walk with Jesus, and especially about how our use of the time, the talents and spiritual gifts we possess, and the financial resources God has entrusted to us are all an important part of this walk. Through bulletin inserts, brief temple talks, and woven into sermons, we will reflect on what it means to WALK, LISTEN, and GIVE as we strive to grow closer to Jesus as we walk together.

The great poet Robert Frost once wrote, "Two roads diverged in a wood, and I—I took the one less traveled by, and that has made all the difference." On our walk with Jesus, it is important that we are on the right road.

When it comes to stewardship, some people ask the question, "The church is always asking for something. How much of my time, my money, and my giftedness does the church need?" This question will send us down the wrong road. It is a question that Jesus never encourages us to ask. It is a question that is based on some wrong assumptions.

Other people ask, "How generously does God call on me to respond to all the blessings God has showered upon me?" This question will send us down the right road, even though it might be less traveled. When you think about your use of the time, talents and treasures God has entrusted to you, it is important to remember that the resources you have still **belong** to God and are placed in your care and management. It is also important to remember that when Jesus talks about giving, he never talks about the need of the church to receive; he always talks about the need of the giver to give as an expression of a sincere faith.

Giving allows us to participate in God's mission to the world. We want to especially think this year about how we live out our baptism in the community. Stewardship is not just about how you serve in the church. God is always inviting us to be hands and feet of good news and service in the world. Emmanuel members are involved in all sorts of service in the community. We want to celebrate these contributions this year as well.

As we walk with Jesus this month, think about all God has entrusted to you. Think about your need to give as a part of your faith in Jesus. **Ask yourself, "How generously does God call on me to respond?"**

ARE YOU READY TO MAKE A NEW YEAR'S RESOLUTION?

There are 10 ways to stay healthy for 2012! The lifestyle choices you make every day affect whether you'll become ill. Are you making the lifestyle choices necessary to protect your health? Here are some tips for healthy living:

- 1. Eat a healthy diet. Focus on fruits, vegetables, red and black beans and whole grains. Limit processed food, sugar, salt and fat.
- 2. Maintain a healthy weight. Your body mass index (BMI) should be less than 25.
- 3. Get at least 150 minutes of moderate-intensity physical activity a week. If you're trying to lose weight, aim for 60 minutes of activity most days. Break a sweat!
- 4. Wash your hands often to stop the spread of germs.
- 5. Don't use tobacco and avoid breathing other people's smoke.
- 6. Manage stress. Take time to relax and enjoy family and friends. Stay positive.
- 7. Get seven to nine hours of sleep each night.
- 8. Get regular checkups with your doctor. Make sure you are up to date on vaccines and recommended and preventive exams, such as mammogram, psa, and colonoscopy.
- 9. If you're outside for more than 12 minutes, wear sunscreen.
- 10. Limit consumption of alcohol to one drink a day for women and two-a-day for men.

Last but certainly not least, take charge of your own health. Your doctor is not in charge of your health, you are.

NEW THURSDAY NIGHT BIBLE STUDY:PAUL'S LETTER TO THE GALATIANS STARTS JANUARY 12, 2012

Galatians stands as Paul's eloquent and vigorous argument for the essential New Testament truth that people are justified by faith in Jesus Christ. He wrote it about 20 years after the death and resurrection of Jesus. Paul asserts that we are sanctified by the obedience that comes from faith in God's work for us, in us, and through us by the grace and power of the Holy Spirit. Galatians is often referred to as "Luther's book," because Martin Luther relied so strongly on this letter in his writings and arguments.


